Jesus Paying Our Debt To God

I just saw this quote and wanted what your understanding of it is:

The servant who had defrauded his master had nothing with which to make restitution. The sinner who has robbed God of years of service has no means of canceling the debt. Jesus interposes between the sinner and God, saying, I will pay the debt. Let the sinner be spared; I will suffer in his stead. {Review & Herald, December 14, 1911 par. 16}

How one understands quotations like this depends on which "law" lens the mind is filtering the quotation.

If one comes to the question already believing God is like a Roman dictator, imposing laws without inherent consequence and therefore is required to police breeches in the law and impose penalties, then one reads quotations like this and construes legal payment conclusions – that are not actually stated.

But, if one starts by first knowing God as Jesus revealed Him to be, understands His character of love, realizes God is the Creator, and His law is the protocols upon which life is built, an expression of His

character of love, then one reads quotations like this and comes to an entirely different conclusion.

Through the "law" lens of love, one realizes mankind was created in the context of a war over God's character, which began in heaven. When mankind was created the angels already existed. (Job 38:3-7) Humanity was gifted with life, the ability to procreate, and dominion, along with a world teeming with beauty and life. Humanity was trusted by God to reveal the truth about God's character.
